» Sprinkler Restrictions

Sprinkling restrictions are in effect from June 1 to September 30 for all residents on the municipal water system. Lawn and yard sprinkling may take place from 7:00 am to 10:00 am and 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm.

- Even numbered address on even numbered days.
- Odd numbered address on odd numbered days.



» FLOOD WATCH

The River Forecast Centre is maintaining a Flood Watch for the Nechako River at the District of Vanderhoof.

The District would like to remind boaters to stay off the river within municipal boundaries. Wakes from boats can damage flood protection works. The Vanderhoof RCMP has informed the District of Vanderhoof that boaters causing wakes can be charged with mischief, and boats can be impounded awaiting a court date (6-12 months).

Residents in low lying areas may be experiencing infiltration of ground water into basements and crawlspaces. In this situation, Northern Health recommends removing saturated

items from your basement. If standing water appears, mix it with a mild detergent.

» 2015 TAX NOTICES

By now you should have received your District of Vanderhoof 2015 tax notice. If you have not received your notice, please call the Municipal Office at 250-567-4711.

The due date/time for payment of 2015 property taxes is July 2, 2015 at 4:30 p.m. local time.


Any outstanding taxes at that date and time will be subject to a 10% late payment penalty. This penalty will also be applied to your Homeowner Grant if it is claimed late.


To avoid line ups you can submit your Homeowners Grant and payment via postdated cheque which will be processed on the tax due date.

For those who like to do business online, you may:

Apply for your Homeowner Grant online

If you are eligible for a District of Vanderhoof Homeowner Grant (HOG), you can apply online at www.vanderhoof.ca.





• Confirm and answer questions by clicking the appropriate boxes when prompted.

If you claim your HOG online you **do not** need to complete and send us the HOG form attached to your tax notice. Remember that the 10% late penalty will also be applied to your HOG amount if not claimed before the due date.

Pay your Property taxes online

You can pay your property taxes online with either CIBC, Royal Bank or Integris Credit Union. The District of Vanderhoof must be set up as a payee in the bill paying section of your online bank site. There will be two payee options available to choose from. **To pay taxes, select the Vanderhoof (District) Tax option.** When asked to enter an account number, use the tax roll number which is located on the top left corner of your tax notice.

IMPORTANT NOTE: When paying taxes online, you must ensure that your transaction is completed at least 3 business days before the due date. Even if your bank records show the payment coming out of your account immediately, it still may take a few days to reach our Municipal account. If your payment does not clear our Municipal account before 4:30 p.m. on July 2, 2015, the late penalty is automatically applied.

Please do not make Municipal tax payments over the counter at the bank. The bank will have to submit these payments to us manually and sometimes they do not arrive before the due date/time. If the payment is not received before the tax due date/time, the late penalty will still be applied.

May 21: Special Meeting of Council

Council decided to call a public meeting as a result of receiving information from Rio Tinto Alcan that stated a 10% chance of river flows over 500 m³/s and a 50% chance of substantial flooding. Council opened the floor to questions. The issue of the White Sturgeon Recovery Centre operating boats on the river was raised. The response was that the boats would be off the river by May 23rd. An inquiry was made into the activation of sump pumps. The response provided by the Fire Chief Ian Leslie, was that Emergency Management British Columbia did not recommend continued pumping as it would compromise drainage around home foundations. Lianne Olson from Rio Tinto Alcan reminded everyone that they intended to have a meeting on Thursday, May 28th, 7 pm at the Friendship Centre.

May 19: Strategy Meeting of Council

Council received a delegation from Rio Tinto Alcan, who provided an update on potential flooding. Emergency Management British Columbia performed an audit in Vanderhoof, and stated that they would be requesting gabions. Fire Chief Ian Leslie provided an update on the fire at Canfor and said that the clean-up was underway. Director of Operations, Paul Carver presented five and ten year Capital Plans stating that the maps would be placed on the website. Council requested that Staff book a venue and advertise a Public meeting for May 21st at 7 pm.

May 11: Regular Meeting of Council

Council received a delegation from Rio Tinto Alcan who provided an update for council about the snow pack levels. Justus Benckhuysen provided summaries for three scenarios spanning three weeks. Council also received a delegation from the Nechako Figure Skating Club, who requested that council allow the club to sub-contract the Arena's concession. Ben Scott provided an update for the Maddy Awareness Campaign requesting permission to place signage and banners.
